During Columbia Bank's Initial Public Offering (IPO), management issued a proxy vote and depositors approved the contribution of 3,576,675 shares to the Columbia Bank Foundation. The passing of this vote exemplifies the true character of our team and our depositors; caring, dedicated, and determined.

We are proud to announce that as of December 31, 2023, the Foundation has disbursed a cumulative total of over \$17 million through grants, sponsorships, and charitable giving. As the Bank and Foundation have grown, we are proud to have also supported our acquired partners Atlantic Stewardship Bank, Roselle Bank, Rahway Savings (RSI) Bank, and the missions of those who have joined our family. In each instance, our combined entity has been able to substantially expand philanthropic efforts.

While our team continues to display their caring, dedicated, and determined nature, disbursements of this size are no small task. As such, we are proud to announce that in 2023, we added an Assistant Director to the Columbia Bank Foundation, introduced a new Large Grant Program and significantly grew our support of affordable housing and housing assistance. An expanded team and additional programming will ensure that we continue to be present in our communities, maintain strong relationships and most importantly, strengthen our impact.

Before I conclude, I would like to thank our team and directors who help to manage one of the largest private foundations in the state. While their efforts well-exceed the length and detail of this report, we are thrilled to give you a glimpse into the important work they do each and every day.



Total Columbia Bank Foundation Disbursements Accumulated



Maintaining a Tradition of Giving

Through recent acquisitions, Columbia Bank has had the opportunity to welcome likeminded clients and employees to the Columbia Bank family. In addition to expanded products and services, our combined entity has ear marked funds to honor acquired banks such as Atlantic Stewardship Bank and Roselle Bank. As part of the merger agreement, the RSI Foundation continues to support local communities within the prior institution's footprint. Organizations that were historically supported by acquired institutions, now have access to a larger Foundation in both scope and size. As a result, charitable support has far exceeded pledged funding.



The Columbia Bank Foundation is proud of its enhanced support to acquired partners. For example, the Foundation has disbursed an annual average of over \$900,000 to previous tithing recipients from Atlantic Stewardship Bank, as opposed to a previous annual average tithing disbursement of \$465,000.

Passaic County CASA


Through years of ongoing support, the Columbia Bank Foundation proudly sponsored the "Voices for Children Gala 2023" specifically, funding the advocacy for abused and neglected children. Passaic County CASA is a non-profit organization which champions the best interests of children in the child welfare system.

Dawn Treader School

The Columbia Bank Foundation provided \$25,000 in funding to repair and replace windows in the Dawn Treader School located in Paterson, NJ. For over 40 years, the school has provided a vibrant educational environment for children ranging from kindergarten to eighth grade.

Our Programs: Grants

The Columbia Bank Foundation's grant program allows local organizations to submit funding requests for initiatives that will create a meaningful impact to our communities. Grant requests are first reviewed for eligibility, then submitted to the Columbia Bank Foundation's Board of Directors for consideration. Our grant program allows us to learn more about the needs of our community, the support required to fulfill those needs, and the desired results once implemented.



Supporting Affordable Housing Initiatives Through Over \$750,000 In Funding

Our Large Housing Grant Program

We believe that everyone deserves an affordable home and opportunity to succeed. That is why the Foundation pledged \$325,000 to a Large Housing Grant program. Through the program, 10 local organizations received funding to support affordable housing initiatives across the state.

Parkside Business & Community in Partnership Inc.

Through a grant of \$50,000, the Columbia Bank Foundation provided support to bolster housing development, provide home repair assistance, and enhance financial empowerment programs. These funds will specifically aid in advancing affordable housing initiatives and promoting financial literacy education by creating an equitable, healthy, and thriving community within Camden's Parkside Neighborhood.

Saint Joseph's Carpenter Society

Through a grant of \$50,000, the Columbia Bank Foundation helped fund Camden's revitalization through the creation of 5 new-construction affordable housing units as well as the gut-rehabilitation of an additional 10 units. Saint Joseph's Carpenter Society is a non-profit, striving to improve the quality of life of Camden residents and its surrounding communities by promoting affordable housing and neighborhood development.

New Jersey Community Development Corporation Inc.

The Columbia Bank Foundation provided \$25,000 of support to expand and enhance CDC's affordable and supportive housing initiatives. Through brick and mortar work, residents can access necessary support with tenancy applications, government assistance and more. Residents will receive assistance in navigating complicated processes, such as tenancy applications and government assistance. NJCDC is a community development corporation dedicated to housing, education, youth development & community building initiatives.



2023 Grant Highlights

Phoenix Center

The Phoenix Center offers real-life learning opportunities through their kitchen and vocational restaurant program. Their onsite facility fosters cooking and restaurant-based skills to promote self reliance at home and employment within the community. Through a grant of \$25,000, the Columbia Bank Foundation supported the "Teaching Kitchen Renovation", including the purchase of new appliances, new counter tops and ultimately an improved learning experience for students.

The Enterprise Center

The Enterprise Center (TEC) of New Jersey, provides consulting, capital, and networking services to local small businesses and minority-owned businesses in the Greater Philadelphia region. Through a grant of \$25,000 the Columbia Bank Foundation financed window repairs to Camden's historical TEC Camden Cares Business Center. The Center provides small business assistance to businesses who have been financially impacted by the pandemic.

Eva's Village

Through a grant of \$50,000, the Columbia Bank Foundation provided predevelopment funding for planning, zoning, permits, architectural, engineering, and legal fees for a new 5-story apartment building to be constructed in Paterson, New Jersey. The Building Healthier (More) Equitable Communities Initiative. is a collaborative effort by Eva's Village, The Oasis Haven for Women and Children and Passaic County Habitat for Humanity. This new building will provide single mothers the opportunity to live in affordable housing located directly above an accessible and affordable early childcare center. Eva's Village provides care and support to individuals struggling with hunger, homelessness, substance use disorders and mental health issues.



Reed Academy

The Reed Academy's "Greens Do Good" Workforce Development Program provides a unique vocational opportunity for students with autism. Through a grant of \$20,000, the Columbia Bank Foundation sponsored 20 teens, who were able to complete 2,000 hours of growing hydroponic farms. The program, in its third year, has grown from 3 students to 65 students from 4 counties and 14 public and private school transition programs. The greens grown are sold to local restaurants and are donated to social service agencies within New Jersey.

Center for Food Action

The Center for Food Action (CFA) provides emergency food packages and homelessness prevention assistance to local low-income individuals and families. A grant of \$30,000 supported the purchase of a new forklift that is used for essential daily tasks such as donation deliveries, pick-ups and organization of food packages. The mission of the Center for Food Action is to "prevent hunger and homelessness and improve the lives of individuals and families living in poverty."

YMCA of Metuchen, Edison, Woodbridge, and South Amboy

The Livestrong® Program at the YMCA offers support to cancer survivors so that they can regain physical and emotional health after a cancer diagnosis. Through a grant of \$5,000 the Columbia Bank Foundation helped to fund a 12-week program that provided resources for post-cancer rehabilitative health and maintenance and improvement. The program gives survivors the opportunity to get back on their feet to increase physical activity, reduce cancer-related fatigue and promote overall health at no cost.



Our Programs: Sponsorships and Charitable Giving

Much like Columbia Bank, the Columbia Bank Foundation proactively supports sponsorship opportunities and provides charitable giving for organizations in need. We recognize that local events are a means to raise funding for meaningful causes and are proud to support fundraising efforts.

The Oasis Haven For Women & Children Inc.

The Columbia Bank Foundation proudly sponsored the "26th Annual Gala of Hope" to raise funds for women and children who wish to succeed in the workforce and flourish academically.



Partners in Learning

The Columbia Bank Foundation was proud to sponsor Partners in Learning's "16th Annual Diamonds and Jeans Fundraiser" event that helps fund ongoing education. The organization assists young children and their families through innovative services that are provided through in-home or non-segregated classrooms. Tools provided help to foster social skills and pre-academic development.

Our Programs: Employee Sponsored Giving

Our third major program reflects how giving back is deeply engrained in Columbia Bank's culture. In 2018, the Foundation launched its Employee Sponsored Giving program which was designed for employees to nominate organizations for donations. Each year, employees submit organizations close to their hearts. Subsequently, the nominations are grouped by overarching mission and distributed each month for a vote. Winning organizations receive a \$10,000 donation, while other nominated organizations receive a smaller donation.

American Foundation for Suicide Prevention NJ (AFSP)

The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention NJ is a voluntary health organization that gives those affected by suicide a community. Empowered by research, education and advocacy to take action against suicide, AFSP creates a culture that is smart about mental health including, funding scientific research, educating the public about mental health and suicide prevention, advocating for public policies in mental health and suicide prevention, and supporting survivors of suicide loss and those affected by suicide.

Special Olympics

The Special Olympics of New Jersey is a not-for-profit 501(c)3 organization whose mission is to provide sports training and athletic competition to children and adults with intellectual disabilities, completely free of charge.



4 Heroes Charity

4 Heroes Charity is a nonprofit 501(c)3 whose mission is to honor the service and sacrifice of first responders who put their lives on the line every day. Comprised of police, fire, military and first responders, members are committed to giving back to the communities in which they serve.





Table to Table is a non-profit organization that serves food insecure individuals throughout Bergen, Essex, Hudson and Passaic counties. The organization "rescues" food from approximately 272 fresh food donor partners (supermarkets, food distributors, restaurants and commercial kitchens) and delivers it the same day free of charge to more than 250 community organizations, including food pantries, food banks, shelters, day care/after school programs, and senior centers.

Get Involved

How to Apply for a Grant

Before applying for a grant, please review the Columbia Bank Foundation guidelines for grant requests

- The minimum grant amount request is \$5,000
- The Foundation Board reviews requests over \$7,500 to \$25,000 on a quarterly basis, for the Housing Grant Program
- The Foundation Board reviews requests over \$7,500 to \$15,000 on a quarterly basis, for the Community Grant Program
- The Foundation Board is scheduled to meet on a quarterly basis
- The 2024 submission deadlines are April 15th, July 15th, and October 15th
- The Board will review one grant proposal per organization during a twelve-month period
- Only completed grant proposals submitted electronically will be considered
